

TIPS JEOPARDY

Rules and Information

1. Materials
 - Jeopardy PowerPoint – available on website
 - Jeopardy Answer Key – available on website
 - What the Experts Say Article(s) to go with the game (answers marked) – available on website
 - Point tickets (6 of each: \$100, \$200, \$300, \$400, \$500) – available on website
 - 2 noisemakers – not provided by TIPS
2. Identify roles
 - Host – job is to read the answers and control the PowerPoint presentation
 - Spotter – one for each team – job is to watch their team and when someone raises their hand to answer a question, the spotter uses the noisemaker and raises their hand so the caller will see them first and let their team member give the response to the question
 - Caller/Scorekeeper – determines which team's spotter makes a noise first (i.e. "calls it"), keeps score by giving appropriate point ticket to each side
3. Divide into two teams
4. Introduce the game
 - This is a game of knowledge and speed
 - Participants may use their copy of the experts article (either from the What the Experts Say Manual or online) to find the answers. All questions and answers come directly from the experts articles.
 - The team that is "spotted" gets to give the response, stated as a question. Ex: The answer is "parent education program using brief parenting interventions." The correct response is "What is *TIPS*?" The response must be in question form.
 - With a correct answer, that team member gets to choose the next category and amount. They do not automatically get to respond to the next question. Each time, they must be "spotted" and "called on" first.
 - With an incorrect answer, both teams may attempt with another response. The team member who is "spotted" and "called on" first may attempt with another response.
5. Flip a coin to see which team goes first. No prizes – just the glory of winning and knowledge gained
6. Allow 3-5 minutes for the teams to select their spotter, organize, and plan strategy.
